**Promote Mental Health and Social Connection:** Highlight the mental health benefits of immersive role play and community involvement, such as stress relief, increased confidence, and social connection, providing participants with a meaningful way to connect with others.

**Preserve and Share Knowledge of Craftsmanship:** Provide resources, tutorials, and workshops on costume design, prop-making, and combat gear construction, helping participants develop new skills in craftsmanship.

**Develop Leadership and Volunteer Programs:** Encourage leadership development by providing opportunities for participants to take on organizational roles, run events, or mentor new members, fostering a sense of ownership and responsibility.
